Don't let the name of the color fool you. This palette has plenty of color. And it also works with just about every other color palette in the collection.

My jumping off point was the fabulous collection of art that <u>One King's Lane</u> put together. I wish that they would do more of these because I think it's very helpful for people who want an affordable collection that looks great together— and collected.

If you read <u>last night's post</u>, you'll see that I already did the palette.

I've never done that before. I always do the room and then create the palette.

Now, you may be confused by that and think— "Don't you need the palette first?" Well, yes, you do, but when creating it, I'm able to see the furnishings next to each other to see what works best.

And because I did the palette first, the colors are not exactly the same. But that's okay too. This palette works beautifully with the blues, neutrals and greens, so there are so many different ways one could go if this was say, your living room.



I rarely look back to see what I've done on other boards at this point. I always try to have some new things not on any other boards. But I do have my favorites like those <u>Barclay Butera Celadon lamps</u> that I've done a number of times.

I also love the simple stream-lined floor lamp from Serena and Lily.

This time, I just knew that I had to do that way cool <u>leather recliner chair from One</u> <u>King's Lane</u>. What I love is that this is a great looking chair and does not look like a recliner at all! Bravo! Great job!

I added some Greek Key pillows, custom-made as well as yet another Version of <u>Schumacher's Hot House Flowers</u> for the drapes. This is the 5th color-way, I believe that I've used of this pattern and each one gives a completely different look to this iconic fabric.

I love drapes that are solid and also beautiful patterns like this one. Some people shy away from pattern, but in this case, I think it gives an unexpected twist to an otherwise fairly casual room. And the neutral color way looks fresh and modern.

If you are ever in doubt if it will be too much, a great trick is to buy one yard of fabric and live with it for a while.

If you look at your other palette boards, you'll see some similarities with other colors like Cleveland Green and Brown Horse, only here the walls are white.

While I love white walls with white furniture, it is possible to do dark furniture with white walls. The trick is to have lots of white in the other furnishings. And then some mid-range tones and black. Then, I think the room looks balanced.
